### CIRCUS

Circus Ginnett had applied to use the Recreation Ground in September. At the Parish Council's request, further information had been supplied concerning the exact location on the Recreation Ground, what sort of acts would take place during the show and provision of public liability insurance and risk assessments. It was agreed that the Circus would be granted permission to use the Recreation Ground in September (exact date to be confirmed) at a hire rate of £50 per day plus a deposit of £150. Public liability insurance and a risk assessment needed to be supplied to the Parish Council as soon as possible but at the latest by end July. **ACTION: The Clerk to liaise with the Circus.**

### BADDESLEY PARK FOOTBALL CLUB

The Government had sanctioned a return to organised sport from 29<sup>th</sup> March. Baddesley Park Football Club were requesting the use of the Recreation Ground from Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> April and that the grass be cut on both sides of Sandy Lane before that date in preparation for their return to play. A request was also made for use of the Recreation Ground on a Tuesday and Wednesday night from 1<sup>st</sup> June and a training plan was supplied. All agreed with the training plan and that the grass should be cut. **ACTION: The Clerk to liaise with the groundsman.**

### SPEED LIMIT REMINDER SIGNS

In line with Government guidelines regarding release from lockdown, it was agreed that the earliest date that a photoshoot could be arranged would be 21<sup>st</sup> June 2021. It was agreed that the date would be confirmed nearer the time. Locations of the signs were discussed and it was agreed that one needed to be installed at the Hoe Lane junction. One of the signs was not working but Cllr Middlewick confirmed that he had a recharged battery. It was thought that the signs were being triggered a lot and therefore the batteries were running down quite quickly. **ACTION: The Clerk to ask the groundsman to liaise with Cllr Middlewick regarding relocation of the signs.**

**PARKING ON GRASSED AREA IN MORTIMER WAY**

Cllr Middlewick had received a complaint from a resident of Mortimer Way concerning vehicles parking on a grassed area and churning up the verges. Trenches were appearing along the green and the area was getting very muddy. The Clerk undertook to contact HCC to ask if dragon's teeth could be installed.

**COUNCIL TAX**

There were discussions around queries regarding recent council tax bills.

Cllr Knight drew attention to an enquiry to TVBC as to why Council tax in North Baddesley was higher than in surrounding areas. It was assumed that TVBC would respond appropriately and copy the Parish Council into their reply. Clarification had also been received from TVBC regarding the 1% increase in the charge per property even though the total precept had remained the same.

It was agreed that, before setting the precept figure next year, TVBC would be asked to confirm the number of Band D properties. This could then be considered at the January 2022 Finance meeting to set the precept.

**ACTION: The Clerk to liaise with TVBC in December for the number of Band D properties.**

**BEADLE**

**ALLOTMENTS**

Cllr Thompson drew attention to the recent spate of vandalism at the allotments and suggested a fence be erected. It was agreed that the groundsman would be asked to quote for a fence to run from the existing deer fence to the rear garden of the last house adjacent to the allotments in Nutburn Road. The new fence should be the same height as the existing fence and composed of the same materials. Hawthorn bushes or similar would then be planted in front of the fence for extra security.
